Recently the El Dorado High school Thespian troop #42 hosted a one night production and the audience donated canned

goods for admission to the play. Those canned goods were donated to the food pantry to be distributed to students and their families.

Our pantry is managed by two Delta Corp Service members that work in our local Safe and Drug Free schools office. Volunteers of all ages, from our Pride youth team to the El Dorado Connections senior citizen volunteers are welcome to sack food for delivery to our local schools.

Donations in the form of non-perishable food items, personal care items, or monetary contributions can be made to the El Dorado School District food pantry at any time. The El Dorado School district food pantry is available to any student in the district that qualifies for free/reduced lunch; or if their family is facing financial hardship. Families are encouraged to talk with their School Counselor to participate in the program.

Thick & Creamy Pumpkin Soup



Served with crispy bacon, this soup will become YOUR new favorite soup!

Servings: 6

Ingredients

- 2 pounds (1 kg) pumpkin, skin & seeds removed, chopped
- 1 onion, roughly chopped
- 2 medium-sized potatoes, peeled and diced
- 1 large carrot, peeled and diced
- 4 cups low sodium chicken or vegetable broth (stock)
- 2 chicken bouillon cubes, crumbled
- Salt and pepper to taste (if needed)
- 1/2 cup half and half (or light cream)
- 1/2 cooked bacon, to serve (optional)
- Fresh parsley, to serve (optional)

How to prepare

- 1. Place all ingredients, except cream, in a large pot or saucepan. Bring to a simmer over medium heat until vegetables are tender.
- 2. Take off heat. Using a stick blender, blend until smooth.
- 3. Add the cream and stir through (do not boil after adding cream).
- 4. Add any salt or pepper if needed, and serve with bacon and parsley (if desired).
